

Menokin portion of Charles Grymes' Inventory, March 13, 1743

Charles Grymes lived at a plantation on Morattco Creek in southern Richmond County. He owned a quarter plantation at Menokin, which was managed by an overseer. This inventory of the Menokin plantation only lists slaves and livestock. The plantation at Menokin was inherited by Grymes' daughter and son-in-law, Philip and Frances Grymes Ludwell of James City County. The couple sold the property to John Tayloe II in 1751.
